

I was delighted to be at our Advent Mass this week which was beautiful. A lovely reminder that we have entered into this special season of waiting and expectation.



As part of our advent journey we are sharing the story of the Jesse tree with the children. The Jesse Tree helps us connect the custom of decorating Christmas trees to the events leading to Jesus' birth.
