## New school dinner menu

Manchester Fayre, our school meal catering providers, are working in partnership with us to encourage and promote healthy eating with our pupils. The school meals are made from scratch in the kitchen by Julie (our catering manager) and her team, using fresh local ingredients. The menus are planned by Manchester Fayre to ensure that they meet national School Food Standards, which aim to positively influence children's eating habits; for example crisps, chocolate and sweets are not allowed to be served, however a fruit and a vegetable must be available each day, and wholegrains and oily fish must also be offered on the menu. Our new Winter/Spring school lunch menu was sent out last week which we encourage you to have a look at and see the range and variety of foods offered on the menu.

The School Food Standards also form the basis for our Healthy School Policy to ensure only healthy foods are included in children's packed lunches and also snacks / drinks brought into school are healthy. To further support us with encouraging pupils to eat healthy, Manchester Fayre's nutrition team are coming into school on Thursday 17th January where they will have available a family workshop for you to attend either after school drop off or before school pick up and will be an opportunity for you to learn more about hidden sugar and fats, to try a variety of tasty healthy foods and to answer any questions you may have about your child's food habits. During the day, the nutrition team will also be
