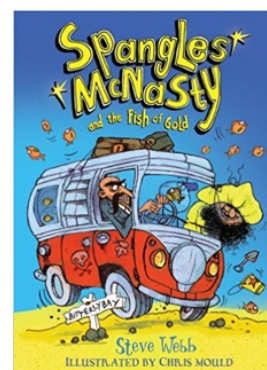


## World Book Day

Dear Parents/ Carers

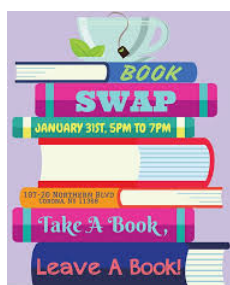
Next week is World Book Day, to celebrate there will be different activities throughout the week.

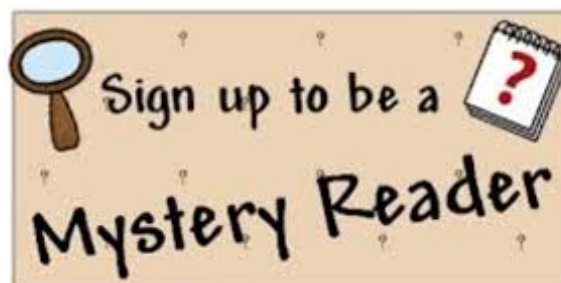
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On Friday 6<sup>th</sup> March all children are invited to attend school dressed as a book character and bring their favourite book to school.
