Dear Parents/Carers,

Wider Opening on Monday March 8th

The arrangements for opening on March 8th remain as they were in the Autumn Term. We will continue to have staggered starts at both the beginning and end of the school day in order to limit the number of people arriving at school. We expect **ALL** parents and carers to arrive wearing a mask when dropping and picking up children unless you are exempt. We also expect people to continue to observe social distancing and remain 2 metres away from other people.

We are now able to allow lunch boxes back into school. I know many of you have asked me about this in the Autumn term and will welcome this.

Unfortunately, whilst the Prime Minister did say that breakfast club and after school provision may commence this has to be with children in the same bubble. As we have limited space, we are unable to offer this provision at the current time. We will continue to allow the drop off from 8.30am for all children including nursery from 8th March.
