Black History Month

Black History Month takes place in October every year and is a celebration of key figures and events

Article of the Fortnight

Article 2 (non discrimination)

The Convention applies to every child without discrimination, whatever their ethnicity, gender, religion, language, abilities or any other status, whatever they think or say, whatever their family background.



Article 30 (children from minority or indigenous groups)

Every child has the right to learn and use the language, customs and religion of their family, whether or not these are shared by the majority of the people in the country where they live.

Mobile Phones

Children in Year 6 who walk home alone are allowed to bring their mobile phone to school. It must be switched off before coming onto the school grounds. Mobile phones are kept in the school office during the school day and given back to home walkers after school. There is no reason for children who are brought to school by and adult and collected from school by an adult to bring a mobile phone to school.

Home Walkers

Children in Year 6 are allowed to walk home from school without an adult with parental consent. In the summer term children in Year 5 will be allowed to walk home from school without an adult with parental consent. Please ensure the office is aware if your child is a Year 6 home walker.
