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


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Dear Parents/Carers and Children,

We often describe this important Spring term as 'Progress Term' and judging by the way the children have returned to school, we know that we'll see some excellent work this term. Every class has returned ready to begin new topics from Arctic Circle in Year 1 to Cry Freedom in Year 4; this term's topics all link to **Culture**.

Reflection

On Sunday, we hear how something special happened to Jesus after his Baptism. The Holy Spirit came down and rested on him. This is a perfect opportunity to think about the Holy Spirit and how it can help us to do what is right.

John the Baptist tells us how he saw the Holy Spirit come like a dove to rest on Jesus. Because of this John believed that Jesus was the Son of God.

A dove is one way that the Holy Spirit shows itself, but most of the time the Spirit is invisible. We cannot see it.

One way to think about the Holy Spirit is the wind. You cannot see the wind, but you can see the branches of the tree moving when the wind blows.

Like the wind, the Holy Spirit is very strong and helps us. We receive the Holy Spirit when we are baptised and the Spirit stays with us all through our lives, helping us to do things that are difficult.
