

## Attendance at St. Elizabeth's

Dear Parents and Carers,

Regular attendance at school is essential if children are to get the best possible start in life. It enables them to access, and engage in, appropriate educational opportunities that provide them with the knowledge and skills to achieve their full potential.

As a school we want all our children to achieve, and we are constantly looking at ways of improving our systems for that to happen. One of the systems we have been reviewing is attendance.

For a school to be considered to have good attendance, we must have attendance of at least 97\%.

## Our current school attendance is $\mathbf{9 3 . 1 \%}$

We are very concerned about this and have made it a key target for our school to improve in this area. We can only achieve this by working together. We are implementing attendance steps which will be in line with Local Authority and Government Guidance. The steps will involve a series of three letters which will be sent if your child's attendance becomes a cause of concern. These letters will go to all families.

| Letter One <br> (Green Band) | Sent to parents whose children have attendance between 98\%-100\% |
| :--- | :--- |
| Letter Two <br> (Yellow Band) | Sent to parents whose children have attendance below 98\%-95\% |
| Letter Three <br> (Amber Band) | Sent to parents whose children have attendance below 95\%-90\% |
| Letter Four <br> (Red Band) | Sent to parents whose children have attendance below 90\% |

Every single day a child is absent from school equates to a day of lost learning.
Attendance percentages can be misleading. For some parents, $90 \%$ attendance may seem like an acceptable level. However, the reality is that $90 \%$ attendance means that your child will miss half a day of school each week or 19 days of school during the school year. That is nearly four school weeks.

The table below shows the amount of lost learning a child may have by missing school. ACADEA

| $100 \%$ attendance | Zero days missed | Perfection! |
| :--- | :--- | :--- |
| $99 \%$ attendance | Two days of absence across the year | Excellent! |
| $97 \%$ attendance | Five days of absence across the year | Good |
| $95 \%$ attendance | Nine days of absence across the year: one week <br> and four days of learning missed. | Satisfactory |
| $90 \%$ attendance | Nineteen days of absence across the year; three <br> weeks and four days of learning missed | Poor |
| $85 \%$ attendance | Twenty-eight days of absence across the year: five <br> weeks and three days of learning missed. | Very Poor |
| $80 \%$ attendance | Thirty-eight days of absence across the year: <br> seven weeks and 3 days of learning missed. | Unacceptable |
| $75 \%$ attendance | Forty-six days of absence across the year: nine <br> weeks and one day of learning missed. | Unacceptable |

We have a range of new incentives in school so every child has the chance of receiving an award at some point during the school year.

- Each term children who have $100 \%$ attendance for the half term will receive a $100 \%$ attendance certificate/bronze attendance badge. If the same child has $100 \%$ attendance for the next term, they will receive a silver badge and if they have 100\% attendance in the final term they will receive a gold badge and will be invited on the $100 \%$ Attendees Reward school trip at the end of the year.
- Each class who has over $98 \%$ attendance will win $£ 5$ for their class fund to be spent at the end of the year on a treat of their choice.
- In our Gold Award weekly assembly we will also have an attendance Wheel of Fortune. Every child who has had $98 \%$ attendance from the week before (ThursdayThursday) will have their name entered into the Wheel of Fortune. If their name is selected, they will win $£ 5$ to add to their class fund to use at the end of the year.


## Punctuality

Arriving at school on time and ready to learn is the best start to the day for our children. Even being 5 minutes late per day can add up to 3.4 school days missed across a year. There are several children arriving past $9 a m$ on a daily basis. Please can I remind you the register closes at 9am; please ensure you arrive at school in plenty of time before then. Amendments have been made to the attendance policy and penalty notices will be given for persistent offenders. | Minutes Late Per Day | How Many School Days/Weeks Missed In 1 Year |
| :--- | :--- |
| 5 minutes late | 3.4 school days missed a year |
| 10 minutes late | 1.4 school weeks missed a year |
| 15 minutes late | 2.6 school weeks missed a year |
| 20 minutes late | 2.8 school weeks missed a year |
| 30 minutes late | 4 school weeks missed a year |

## School Meals and Late Arrivals

Any child arriving at school after 9.30am will no longer be offered the full menu choice from the kitchen for that day. They will be offered either pasta or wedges. Our kitchen staff are struggling to meet the orders of children when they arrive late resulting in food waste.

## Holiday Requests

Holidays during term time will not be authorised. Any holiday taken during term time will be recorded as an unauthorised absence. Children absent from school due to a holiday will miss out on important learning and will fall behind with their school work. There are only 190 statutory school days, leaving 175 days not in school for holidays to be arranged outside term time.

When school receives holiday requests, you will receive a letter informing you that school cannot authorise the leave of absence and that a penalty notice fine will be issued upon return if the leave of absence is more than 5 days. If you would like further information in regards to this please refer to our attendance policy on our school website.

## Illness

If your child is genuinely unwell and unable to attend school, please telephone the school office and leave a message before 9.00am on each day of illness. We must have a reason for each day a child is absent from school and if we do not we will contact you, either by telephone or by home visit. We may also request medical evidence of illness. Please see the attendance policy for more details.

Please find attached to this letter the term dates for the next academic year (2023-24), so you have plenty of time to plan your holidays around these dates.
